#### Greetings,

I trust this note finds you well during this season of hope, it is time to break out the winter coats, hats, and mittens! As Father John Wall said, "May we be renewed and energized in our faith, grounded in hope and transformed by His love to give witness to His good news to the poor". Blue bags for the St. Lucy "Reverse Advent" Program have started to come in already. As a reminder, please make sure the bags are returned by Thursday, January 3<sup>rd</sup> so they can be picked up by Catholic Charities the following day. Let us continue to assist, encounter, and transform those less fortunate.

A new trimester gives us all the opportunity to begin anew. Please allow me to ask for your cooperation in an arrival/dismissal concern I have. We are addressing tardies (8 or more/trimester for third through eighth grade) with lunch recess reflections this week. We are hopeful that tardies will be reduced overall after sharing some strategies with our students. I am also asking that families avoid early dismissals (between 2:30-2:55 p.m.) if at all possible. These early dismissals disrupt the class they depart, class content is missed, and it can be a challenge for the front office. Thank you in advance for your help in these two areas moving forward. On a positive note, tardiness, first thing in the morning, seems to have been reduced since the beginning of this week so we are off to a good start in the second trimester.

Thank you to all the parents, teachers, and students who attended the Christmas Program. A special note of thanks to Ms. Ceci and Ms. Hunt, the children were awesome. Stay tuned for the Preschool Christmas Program on Tuesday, December 18<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. Christmas break commences with an Early Dismissal on Friday, December 21<sup>st</sup> at 11:30 a.m, Extended Day will not be available and school resumes on Thursday, January 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2019. Please remember Mrs. Daugherty in your prayers who will miss several weeks for a knee replacement in early January. Here's to a speedy recovery.

Parents, please note that applications for FACTS financial assistance can now be submitted. The deadline is Friday, March 15<sup>th</sup> but "The early birds get the most worms." Once again, we have added some additional safety precautions since the recent incident at the parish. We have increased security at the church during our weekly mass and our Crisis Management Team has met multiple times to consider current practices and possible revisions moving forward. One other change in particular is that the front doors will remain monitored and locked until Extended Day hours end at 6:00 p.m. An

additional staff member was needed to accommodate this change so please note beginning Thursday, January 3<sup>rd</sup> Extended Day rates will change from \$7/hour for the first child to \$8/hour. If applicable, the second, and all remaining children in a family, will be charged \$7/hour instead of \$6/hour. Our finance manager, Greg Mott, will make the necessary changes on FACTS beginning in the new calendar year. Due to this revision, the hourly rate will not increase for the 2019-2020 school year and the rates will remain at \$8/hour and \$7/hour. I would like to thank all our parents and teachers for their continued support and I continue to be ever grateful to our wonderful students for their spiritual development, academic efforts, empathy toward others, and positive behavior.

Merry Christmas and I look forward to seeing many of you at Breakfast with Santa on Saturday morning!

## Notes from the Nurse

We are all spending more time being cozy, warm inside due to the cold and wet weather. This coziness brings about some issue related to health that we need to keep in mind.

Cold/Flu – please remind your students to wash hands often and to stay home when they don't feel well. The Sick Day Guidelines are attached to this bulletin. I am tracking flu & strep cases on a daily basis. I have also talked with the VA Department of Health regarding our tracking. St. John's School is doing excellently in minimizing strep & flu thus far.

Head Lice – the occurrence of head lice in schools is on the rise throughout the state according to the Department of Health. Please remind your students to never share personal items and to avoid touching each other's hair. Please keep coats, hats, etc hung up and put away to prevent spread.

If we work together, we can minimize the health hazards that come with every winter season.

I pray that you and your family have a very blessed Advent & Christmas Holiday.

### St. John the Evangelist School Sick Day Guidelines

The most important way to help stop the spread of infectious illness is to keep your child home when they are sick.

According to school policy your child should be kept at home when:

- · He or she has a temperature of 100.4 or higher
- · Has vomited and/or had diarrhea at least 3 times in a 24 hour period
- · Has symptoms that will keep your child from participating in learning, such as
  - Very tired
  - Lack of appetite
  - Uncontrollable cough
  - Sneezing often
  - Headache
  - Body aches
  - Earaches
  - Sore throat minor sore throat is OK for school if no other symptoms mentioned above are present
  - Severe/Bad sore throat should be assessed for strep throat
- Has excessive and constant coughing or sneezing and/or nasal congestion as often this spreads sickness to others.

24 Hour Rule

- Fever your child may not attend school until he/she has been without fever for 24 hours without medications to lower fever such as ibuprofen or acetaminophen.
- Vomiting/Diarrhea your child may not attend school until he/she has been without vomiting (at least 3 times in 24 hour period defines vomiting) or diarrhea for 24 hours without medications such Imodium.
- Antibiotics your child may not attend school if he/she is being treated with an antibiotic until they have received at least 24 hours of the medication.

PLEASE NOTE: NO MATTER THE SEVERITY OF SYMPTOMS, IT IS AT THE DISCRETION OF THE SCHOOL NURSE AND/OR ADMINISTRATION IF A STUDENT WILL BE SENT HOME OR EXCLUDED FROM SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT DUE TO ILLNESS.
