FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK...

Greetings,

As you know, we have partnered once again with Catholic Relief Services and we have the opportunity to follow the Good Samaritan's example. During the Lenten season, we are asking our school families to embrace prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Focusing on the latter, I am reminding our school families to fill their CRS Rice Bowls. Noted on the box, \$40 helps provide one month of food for a family, two years of seed for a farmer, and one emergency kit for refugees. Encourage your children to see that it is always better to give then it is to receive. As always, let us continue to share with our brothers and sisters in need.

Now that the weather has turned and we are in spring uniforms, I would ask all families to review our dress code guidelines. Please pay special attention to the length of skirts and socks, color of shoes, and as a reminder, black belts are required for boys as a part of our school uniform. If the attire is questionable, please ask your child to change before arrival. We always want to avoid this situation and it is embarrassing for the child.

On another note, we almost had an accident in morning carpool last week. Please avoid using devices during drop-off and afternoon carpool and remain aware of all surroundings. The safety of our students is a top priority; they are truly the best and deserve our full attention in the parking lot.

Please avoid scheduling morning appointments during the next four weeks so we can limit the number of make-up assessments.
