### FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK...

#### GREETINGS...

Welcome back to all members of our school community. My appreciation goes out to faculty, staff, and maintenance for all your hard work as we begin another school year. A word of gratitude to Mr. Griffin (class of 1987) for welcoming our families on the first day of school, it is a small world indeed and we are thrilled to have the next generation of Griffins here at SJES.

Please continue to check our website (sjesva.org) for early dismissals, holidays, upcoming events, etc. There are a few additional Half Days in the first quarter due to Diocesan and parish dates but we will typically have an average of one per month beginning in November. In terms of parent involvement, we encourage you to remain active in your children's education so please continue to check homework online in addition to your child's agenda. For new families, there is a "homework" tab directly on the front page of our website and our uniform guidelines can also be found under "Resources" for your convenience. Returning families are reminded that there was a change made to the Middle School Fall/Spring dress uniform and the changes are attached. If you would like further clarification on uniforms or any other matters, please feel free to contact the front office.

Parents, the first few days of school are now complete so I would ask that you please drop your children off in the morning carpool line for the remainder of the year. It is important that our students (regardless of age) learn to practice independence and responsibility. I know it is challenging to let go but the children will develop a sense of pride once they realize we trust them to accomplish this task on their own. Thank you for your cooperation.

The first round of standardized testing (Performance Series by Scantron) will take place from September 11-29<sup>th</sup> for our 3-7<sup>th</sup> grade students. These students will be tested three times a year once again in Math, Reading, and Language Arts. I am delighted to report that we showed the largest growth in Reading and the second largest growth in Math in terms of gains analysis in the entire Diocese of Arlington which includes 37 elementary/middle schools! Our Kindergarten through second grade students will take the PALS assessment in the fall and once again in the spring to monitor student growth as well. Please avoid scheduling vacations or appointments during this timeframe if at all possible so testing makeups are limited.

I encourage you to attend our annual Back to School Night on Thursday, September 14<sup>th</sup> beginning at 7:00pm. This is a great opportunity to learn more about our school, classroom instruction from our teachers, and the opportunities that are available at St. John the Evangelist. Mrs. Lynch, our PTO president, will also speak briefly about volunteer opportunities that are available for this coming year. Our first Spirit Night, Back to School Picnic, and annual parish Oktoberfest is quickly approaching. - Criminal Background Checks for Volunteers & VIRTUS Requirements As part of the diocesan initiative to maintain a safe environment for all of our children, all volunteers with "substantial contact" with children are required to complete a background check prior to working in the school and to complete VIRTUS training. All parents who wish to attend field trips or volunteer in support of classroom activities are required to complete the background check process and attend VIRTUS training. As we begin a new year, in accordance with diocesan policy, only those parents who have completed the criminal background check are eligible to volunteer in the school. Those who have not yet completed the background check process may request a packet of forms from the front office.

#### Dear Parents,

Again this year, St. John the Evangelist School is presenting a health program to its students. My name is Kathleen Weghorst, and I will be the guest teacher for the next ten weeks leading the *Too Good for Drugs* program (*Too Good*). *Too Good* in elementary and middleschool teaches the fundamental elements of social and emotional learning through developmentally appropriate activities that set the foundation for a healthy adolescence. Lessons build the skills children need to set daily goals, identify and manage emotions and feelings, and make healthy choices that contribute to their overall health and well-being.

Too Good is a nationally recognized program that teaches five essential social and emotional learning skills, which research has linked with healthy development and academic success:

- Goal Setting
- Decision Making
- Bonding with pro-social others
- Identifying and managing emotions
- Communicating effectively

I work for Fauquier CADRE, Inc., a local non-profit organization established in 1989. CADRE is a community coalition of concerned people who are working together to prevent the use and abuse of alcohol and drugs by area youth. CADRE is made up of citizens, private business people, law enforcement officials, educators, parents, and counselors. I am also a certified teacher who has taught both general and special education to students in grades Kindergarten through 8<sup>th</sup> grade.
