

FROM THE HEALTH COORDINATOR...



I would like to offer some clarification at this time in regards to our school's policies and procedures, this school year, for managing reported positive COVID test results for an individual.

If an individual informs our school administration a positive COVID test has been received the following actions will take place:

- -We will contact the health department to report the positive COVID case.
- -A 48-hour time frame prior to the start of an individual's symptoms (if asymptomatic the positive COVID test will be the date used) will be determined.
- -Contact tracing will be completed to identify "close contacts" and those that may have had a higher potential risk of exposure during those 48 hours.
- -Non-vaccinated individuals found to be a "close contact" will be contacted as soon as possible and informed they will need to quarantine for 10 days from the determined last contact with the positive case (the date of last contact will count as day 0 when determining a return date). These individuals may choose to receive a COVID test <u>5-7 days</u> after last exposure. If the individual is symptom free and a negative test result has been received, the individual can return to school.
- -If vaccinated (with the second dose being greater than 2 weeks prior to the exposure) and determined to be a "close contact" the individual may return to the school the next day as long as they are symptom free, continue to self-monitor for symptoms for 14 days following exposure, and wear a face covering appropriately.
- -Proof of vaccination will need to be provided for these individuals. It is also recommended by the Virginia Department Health (VDH) that vaccinated individuals found to be a "close contact" receive a COVID test <u>3-5</u> **days** after exposure.
- -Those found to be a higher potential of risk for exposure will be notified via email as soon as possible so they can monitor for possible symptoms.
- -To uphold HIPAA requirements that include individual confidentiality, if contact tracing for a reported positive COVID case reveals there to be no "close contacts" or individuals identified at a higher potential of risk for exposure in our school community, there will be no notifications communicated to our school community regarding such cases.

I hope this information offers some better transparency in regards to how we will be executing our response to any reported positive COVID test this school year and our intentions for how we plan to keep our school community as safe, healthy, and protected as possible.
