Set the Audiometer volume value (db) to 35 to begin the test in each of the three frequencies. Lower the db value by 5 db until the student signals they cannot hear the lower value. Write the lowest db value

the student hears in the appropriate column. Do not test below 20db or higher than 35db without the Nurses instructions.

If the student has all values of 20db for both ears mark the test as PASS

If the student has one value of 25db and the rest of the values are 20bd for both ears mark the test as PASS

If two or more test values are 25db mark the test as Referred

If a test value is 30db or higher for either ear mark the test as Referred

We are proud to announce the 2019 Fauquier Fun Run and Relay meet. The event is open to athletes currently in grades K - 8th. It is designed to appeal to boys and girls at all levels of experience, from novices to competitive athletes.

The fun run is a great opportunity for younger athletes to learn about the sport of Cross Country. For all athletes, emphasis will be placed on teamwork, and provide fun exposure to the joys of running.
