Dear SJES Families,

Fall weather appears to be on the horizon. We have been abundantly blessed with plenty of sunshine and it is proven that all stakeholders benefit when the children are able to get outside and "blow the dirt off of you" as my father used to say:)

Our CYO fall sports teams are off and running. Cross Country has roughly 50 runners competing this year and the season will continue until the Championship meet in early November. Tennis has nine players and although youthful (6 fifth graders that have never played), they are making significantly progress and won their first match last Sunday. 

Testers: Please test and mark the hearing results as follows:

Set the Audiometer volume value (db) to 35 to begin the test in each of the three frequencies. Lower the db value by 5 db until the student signals they cannot hear the lower value. Write the lowest db value

the student hears in the appropriate column. Do not test below 20db or higher than 35db without the Nurses instructions.

If the student has all values of 20db for both ears mark the test as PASS

If the student has one value of 25db and the rest of the values are 20bd for both ears mark the test as PASS

If two or more test values are 25db mark the test as Referred

If a test value is 30db or higher for either ear mark the test as Referred



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



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Fauquier Fun Run & Relays

We are proud to announce the 2019 Fauquier Fun Run and Relay meet. The event is open to athletes currently in grades K - 8th. It is designed to appeal to boys and girls at all levels of experience, from novices to competitive athletes.

The fun run is a great opportunity for younger athletes to learn about the sport of Cross Country. For all athletes, emphasis will be placed on teamwork, and provide fun exposure to the joys of running.

Athletes can choose to run in a relay with their own team or be placed on a team. Teams can be all girls, all boys or co-ed (2 girls and 2 boys).
