FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK...

Greetings,

The Advent season approaches. As Pope Francis once said, "The time of Advent…returns us to the horizon of hope, a hope that does not disappoint because it is founded on the Word of God." It encourages us to live closer to Christ and utilize the holiday season to share our faith and traditions with our family and school community.

Speaking of reflection, please note that the first trimester will end on Tuesday, November 26th. Report cards (hard copies) will go home on Friday, December 6th. This is a good opportunity to pause and reflect on academic/behavioral progress made for the first third of the 2019-2020 school year. A short conversation and continued interest in their spiritual, academic, and social develop will have a significant impact. As the weather begins to turn, I would like to notify all families that our inclement weather policy remained the same as the 2018-2019 school year. In short, we will follow Fauquier County Public Schools for three consecutive **snow** days. Exception- a local decision will be made if Fauquier County closes purely due to extreme temperatures. We do not have students standing outside in the cold weather for any length of time so we will make our own call if the cancellation is purely temperature-related. To review this policy in it's entirety, please refer to the Parent Handbook.

Speaking of safety, all diocesan schools will hold a meeting with the diocesan Risk Management staff in the coming weeks. We will continue to review security measures at SJES to see how we can improve. I am happy to report that all exteriors doors to St. John School have been re-keyed and although there have been some hiccups, upgrades have been made to our Ident-A-Kid system for visitor entrance. Your children's safety remains our primary concern.

Applications for the 2020-2021 Diocesan Tuition Assistance Program may now be submitted. The application deadline for elementary schools is in March but please complete the necessary paperwork as early as possible- early birds get the biggest worms. This is an excellent program that saw over 3 millions dollars disseminated to all diocesan families for the 2018-2019 school year. Those who do not meet the criteria for this particular program remain eligible for financial assistance through the Diocesan Scholarship Fund and/or our parish tuition assistance program. Specific information will following once it is received from the diocese.

Please keep Father Gould in your prayers as he transitioned to St. Francis de Sales in Purcellville. Several students shared their musical talents for him during our send-off Tuesday afternoon and I know our wonderful students. Please welcome Father Smith with open arms as he officially begins his St. John assignment on Monday, November 18th. He stopped by to visit last week and I am confident he will be a good fit. Today, and all days, may we pray, learn, and serve.
