Dear Parents,

On behalf of our faculty and staff, I would like to extend greetings of peace as we begin preparations for the Lenten season. We will attend Ash Wednesday Mass on Wednesday, February 26th and our first school-wide Stations of the Cross will be Monday, March 3rd at 2:15 p.m. We will attend Stations of the Cross once a week during Lent rotating days each week. Please refer to the school calendar for weekly dates, all are families are welcome to attend.

Speaking of the calendar, the final day of school for students will be **Friday**, **June 5**th. Catholic Faith Camp will be available to various grades from Monday, June 8th -June 12th in various areas of the school.

For your 2020-2021 planning purposes, the first day of school for students will be **Wednesday, August 26, 2020**. The Office of Catholic Schools Christmas break is currently set from December 23-January 1 but there is flexibility in this part of the schedule. The last day of school with 3 snow days will be **Friday, June 11th** if the proposed OCS Christmas break is implemented. If St. John decides to extend the Christmas break for next year, the last day of school for the 2020-2021 school year will change to **Tuesday, June 15th**. A final decision regarding the length of the Christmas break will be made before the Easter break. Please note that the last day of school moving forward will not move up therefore I would ask that you please avoid scheduling family vacations until after the middle of June next year.

As always, I remain grateful to our school families. Many of you are so giving of your time and more importantly; your commitment to charity. The four young girls (Christina-Grade 5, Maria-Grade 4, Virginia-Grade 2, and Maura-Grade 2) that we sponsored from Mozambique, Africa last year continue to do well. Their school began last week and I am pleased to report that we have raised over \$1,000 to date for the Sunshine Foundation Approach this year. It only takes \$300 to give a young child a Catholic education for one year so we are approaching four students once again this year. Mrs. Terrie Larson, director of the Sunshine Foundation Approach, would like to extend her sincere gratitude for your assistance. 
Box Tops-Please continue to send in clipped box tops. For scanned box tops please use your receipt and box top app.

Dear St. John Families,

With this being flu season and the recent outbreak of the Wuhan (2019-nCov) Coronavirus, it is only sensible to remind families of the precautions set forth by the CDC.

Coronaviruses are a large family of respiratory viruses that range from people being mildly sick to people being severely ill. Symptoms can include: *Fever*

Cough Difficulty breathing

The CDC believes at this time, that symptoms may appear in as few as 2 days or as long as 14 after exposure.

There is currently no vaccine to prevent 2019-nCoV infection. Preventative measures are the same ones we take to prevent the spread of the flu, the common cold and other viruses. The best way to prevent infection is to avoid being exposed to this virus. The CDC recommends these preventive actions:

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol if soap and water are not available. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.

Avoid close contact with people who are sick.

Stay home when you are sick.

Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash, then wash your hands as mentioned above.

Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.

In addition, school guidelines state that students need to be *fever free for 24 hours* (CDC considers a person to have a fever when he or she has a measured temperature of at least 100.4 °F [38 °C]) <u>without</u> the use of fever reducing medication before returning. The 24-hour rule also applies to illnesses involving diarrhea.

We are taking precautions to ensure the health and well-being of all our students and staff at St John. The teachers and staff are reinforcing the preventative actions mentioned and the staff are executing extra cleaning measures. There are several hand sanitizer stations throughout the buildings. It would be most helpful to review these preventative measures with your students.

Your Primary Health Care Provider, local Health Department and the CDC website have more detailed information available.

DIOCESAN TUITION ASSISTANCE PROGRA

Academic Year 2020-2021

What is the program?

The Diocesan Tuition Assistance Program provides financial assistance to families in Catholic schools in the Diocese of Arlington through funding from diocesan parishes as well as the Rooted in Faith~Forward in Hope Capital Campaign Endowment. It is open to all qualified students whose parents might not otherwise be able to pay the full cost of tuition.

Who is eligible?

- Students attending or accepted by a Diocese of Arlington Catholic school (K-12).
 - Preschool and Pre-K are not eligible.
 - Not applicable to students of private Catholic schools associated with the Diocese and/or international students.
- Students who are Catholic and members of a parish in the Diocese of Arlington or military base parish.
- Families who reside within the boundaries of the Diocese of Arlington and are registered and active members of a diocesan parish or a military base parish.

How do I apply?

- Submit financial aid assessment application and all supporting tax documentation by due date
 - Applications will be completed electronically online at <u>online.factsmgt.com/Signin</u>
 Only one application is required per family.
- Remit processing fee.
- Families seeking aid for students in BOTH ELEMENTARY AND HIGH SCHOOL should follow the high school submission date.

Awards

Awards are made for ONE ACADEMIC YEAR and are based on each family's demonstrated financial need. Individual schools determine the amount and the distribution of all awards for each academic year. The schools will contact families when award decisions have been made. Once these final award decisions have been made, the schools will then credit the tuition accounts of approved families.
