Dear Parents,

The week of March 15-19, 2021 will be a momentous week for the Saint John the Evangelist Catholic School community. During this week the Design for Excellence Accreditation visit will take place. The visit signifies both an ending and a new beginning. The ending is in the culmination of the 18-month self-study process, whereby the staff carefully examined and documented educational processes and practices within the school for the past several years. Through the report writing process, goals were identified for areas of possible improvement.

Over the course of four days, the visiting team will spend time getting to know our school. They will meet virtually, or in person, with Father Smith, Mr. Macdonald, and all staff members. In addition, they will visit the classrooms to see the students learning. On Thursday, March 18, 2021, Mary Pat Schlickemaier, the visiting team chair, will share its findings with the administration and the staff. They will offer suggestions for improvement as well. The end of the visit marks the beginning of the next phase of the school improvement process. Guided by the school mission, the staff will generate a plan based on the recommendations of the committee. This plan will serve to illuminate the path for our journey toward spiritual and academic excellence over the next five years.

Saint John the Evangelist School recognizes and values the role of the parents in the educational process. Due to Covid restrictions, we cannot hold the public session to introduce this dedicated team of professionals to you. In lieu of the public session, we offer you a glimpse of the team by way of short biographies. The visiting team is composed of five educational consultants and teachers selected by the Office of Catholic Schools. Combined, this team represents close to 100 years of educational experience primarily in the Diocese of Arlington. We are grateful for their time and attention in helping us by identifying those special strengths that make our school unique, as well as offering suggestions for growth. We ask that as you read the short biographies below, you offer a simple prayer of gratitude for the opportunity to learn from this team. Marie Scheessele, Core Member





What is the program?

The Diocesan Tuition Assistance Program provides financial assistance to families in Catholic schools in the Diocese of Arlington through funding from diocesan parishes as well as the *Rooted in Faith-Forward in Hope* Capital Campaign Endowment. It is open to all qualified students whose parents might not otherwise be able to pay the full cost of tuition.

Who is eligible?

- Students attending or accepted by a Diocese of Arlington Catholic school (K-12).
 - *Preschool and Pre-K are not eligible.*
 - *Not applicable to students of private Catholic schools associated with the Diocese and/or international students.*
- Students who are Catholic and members of a parish in the Diocese of Arlington or military base parish.
- Families who reside within the boundaries of the Diocese of Arlington and are registered and active members of a diocesan parish or a military base parish.

How do I apply?

- Submit financial aid assessment application and all supporting tax documentation by due date
 - Applications will be completed electronically online at online.factsmgmt.com/Signup
 - *Only one application is required per family.*
- Remit processing fee.
- Families seeking aid for students in *BOTH ELEMENTARY AND HIGH SCHOOL* should follow the high school submission date.

January 18, 2021

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

March 17, 2021
