Dear SJES Families,

As I write this note, I am thrilled that our school community is physically back together for the 2020-2021 school year. Bishop Burbidge and our superintendent, Dr. Vorbach, both called to check in during the first week and offered their prayers. We begin each morning praying for a particular school family and ask that you pray as well for a happy, healthy, and holy school year. Challenges, obstacles, and moments of frustration will continue to occur but we have been inspired by the faith, obedience, and resiliency of your children. Your understanding and continued support as parents while we navigate unchartered territory is appreciated. 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Notes from the Clinic

Dear Parents,

As we navigate through the beginning of the school year, St. John's is taking full measures to keep students and staff members safe during COVID-19. We are so grateful for your cooperation so far on our school mask/face covering policy during these uncertain times.

Our healthcare team has noticed a number of students coming into school with bandanas and gaiters rather than CDC approved face masks or face shields. After speaking with our Rappahannock and Rapidan County Health Coordinator, St. John's policy has updated our face covering policy due to the study that states bandanas and gaiters do not offer protection from respiratory droplets.

We are asking that all 4-8 grade students, visitors and staff wear either a face mask or face shield that goes below the chin and covers the side of the face. According to the CDC, students in K-3rd grade are not required to wear a mask/face covering but it is strongly recommended.

We understand these options are not as comfortable, however St. John's is committed to providing safety towards our community on and off campus.

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Cafeteria Reminders

Due to the new safety measures in place to prevent the spread of Covid-19, we have implemented a few changes to the way we will serve lunches. Students will eat lunch in their classrooms at this time. We will continue to offer lunches through Campus Cuisine.

An account will need to be set up your child(ren) with campus cuisine to place orders. For those who have used this program in the past, you will need to update your child's information. All orders/changes need to be placed by 12:00pm the day before.

- Sign in or Register at https://www.campuscuisine.net with the access code SJES540.
- 2. Click Students to add or edit them. Please update their grades for the new school year!
- Click Order lunches on the student profile. The deadline to order is noon EST the day before.
- 4. View options for Monday or click the arrow to view other weekday options.
- 5. Enter a quantity for each menu item that you wish to order and check at least one date.
- 6. Click add to cart.
- 7. Repeat for each student.
- 8. When you are finished, click your cart and click checkout.
- Payment can be made via PayPal, Amazon Pay, Apple Pay or by entering your credit card. If you click to apply a credit, please be sure to complete the order, since the credit will be removed from your account at that time.
- 10. Click "Calendar" to see your upcoming lunches. Alternatively, you may click "Lunch List" and enter a student or day of the week in the search bar to view lunches in chronological order by date.
- 11. To change or cancel lunches, click "Calendar", select a lunch and click "cancel". You may also click "Lunch List" and "delete". You will receive a credit that can be applied to your next purchase. Credits must be used to purchase other lunches, are not refundable and expire in June.
